



## Evenwood CofE Primary School's Sports Premium Impact 2020-2021



In the 2020/21 academic year, we received £16,650. Due to COVID affecting the 2019-20 academic year, we also carried over £3361. The total amount to spend this year, including monies carried over was £20,011. The money was spent to ensure that all five grant conditions were fulfilled. The grant conditions are as follows:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity.
2. The profile of PE and sport raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
5. Increasing participation in competitive sport.
